<p>About the Organizer</p>	<p>Jiangxi College of Foreign Studies is the only higher vocational college dominated by training foreign language and foreign economic and trade application-oriented talents in Jiangxi Province, it is a co-developed college of the People’s Government of Jiangxi Province and the Ministry of Commerce of China and one of the first batches of MOFCOM Training Bases for International Business Officials.
