## THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to the South-South Cooperation, in particular, the Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasizes on the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which are essential for a country's development such as agriculture, economy, finance, public management and administration, science & technology and ICT, health diplomacy, safety and security including cyber security, cultural diplomacy, social development, environment-related to SDG2030, education, industrial and technical training. Annually, Malaysia offered more than 60 technical and capacity-building programs under the MTCP, which have benefited more than 35,500 participants from 144 countries.

### OBJECTIVES OF MTCP

- 1.To share the development experience with other countries;
- 2.To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- 3.To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- 4.To promote technical cooperation among Developing Countries.

## MARITIME ACADEMY SULTAN AHMAD SHAH (AMSAS)

The Maritime Academy Sultan Ahmad Shah (AMSAS) was named in honour of HRH the Sultan Of Pahang. Officiated AMSAS on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2012.

Located in Pahang, Sungai Ular, Gebeng. AMSAS was commenced Enlisted Personnel Recruit Training with the Royal Malaysian Navy (RMN) at the RMN Base in Lumut. In July 2007, was commenced Officer's initial training. Shifted to a temporary training center at the Maritime District Office in Kuantan Officers Initial Training at MMEA. At the early stage, basic training for other ranks (7 batches) was at RMN Recruit's Training Center, Tg. Pengelih, Johor (KD SULTAN ISMAIL) for 17 weeks. It's continuation Training in Kuantan for a further 4 months. At the year October 2007, officially commenced Officer's training in Kuantan including 4 batches were trained for a duration of 13 months each including 4 months of on job training (OJT) at sea.

The early 2009, AMSAS was develop in two phase:

1<sup>st</sup> Phase was completed in June 2011

2<sup>nd</sup> Phase was completed in March 2012 in August 2011,

AMSAS began operations with the state of the Art Infrastructure and Facilities. AMSAS capable of accommodate 900 trainees at any one time.
