ABOUT MTCP

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasises on the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. As of 31st December 2023, 37,815 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

- To share development experiences with other developing countries;
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC)

ABOUT SEARCCT

Established on 1 July 2003, the Southeast Asia Regional Centre for Counter-Terrorism (SEARCCT). The Centre aims to conduct research, capacity-building and public awareness programmes in countering terrorism. Since its inception, SEARCCT has held various types of training courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, and forums, in collaboration with numerous countries, under five (5) core areas, which are:

- (i) Investigation and Legal Aspects;
- (ii) Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (CBRNE) and Crisis Management;
- (iii) Terrorism Financing;
- (iv) Critical Infrastructure Protection (CIP); and
- (v) Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (P/CVE)

SEARCCT conducts research activities in terrorism and counter-terrorism related issues such as Aviation Security, Youth and Terrorism, Internet Radicalisation and Cyber Security via field-work and academic exercises. The Centre has also published articles and monographs and is actively involved in delivering papers and lectures at the local, regional and international level.

COURSE BACKGROUND

Terrorist groups have shown interest in acquiring CBRNE agents for their operations. This training programme will identify and expose the various methods and response when dealing with a CBRNE threat along with Terrorism 101

The programme will define a CBRNE terrorist incident and discuss the likely targets of terrorist attack. The programme will also present the type and characteristics of various CBRNE agents and its effect in Terrorism context. The response structure in dealing with such threats will also be discussed.

COURSE OBJECTIVE

- To raise awareness of the shared CBRNE threat among policy and operational Agencies;
- To identify policies and practices to reduce the threat of CBRNE by enhancing multisectoral coordination and response to potential incidents;
- To explore strategies and approaches to enhances multi-sectoral information in addressing CBRNE; and
- To introduce Malaysian best practices in handling CBRNE threat.

METHODOLOGY

The programme will provide a series of lectures, group discussions and study visits. Representatives from each country will be required to present a 10-minute country report on the mechanism and practices in dealing with the CBRNE threat. The presentation should include the issues and responses of the country in handling the CBRNE threat.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Officers from institutes/ governments and other public agencies. Priority will be given to candidates/ officers whose nature of work involves in either one of the following:

- First Responders: Officials from:
 - i) Fire and Rescue; and
 - ii) Medical Services.
- Law Enforcement: Law enforcement officials with knowledge and background in:
 - i) Counter-terrorism:
 - ii) CBRNE Crisis Management; and
 - iii) Forensic Investigation.

- To be eligible to apply, applicants are obliged to fulfil the following requirements:
 - i) Must demonstrate good command of spoken and written English;
 - ii) Certified medically and physically fit to attend the programme; and
 - iii) Age between 26 50 years old;

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

Participants will receive support from the Governments of Malaysia including:

Accommodation 8 1

Participants will be accommodated at a hotel / hostel within the vicinity of the training institute. Participants are strictly not allowed to bring any family members during the programme.

Meals

Meals will be provided throughout the duration of the course. Please justify food allergy in application form

Air Fares

A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants.

Course Fees

All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.

Daily Allowance

Participants will be provided with a daily allowance.

Attire

Participants are required to dress in formal or office attire throughout the class sessions as well as during official visits to Government Ministries/ Agencies.

VISA AND VACCINATION

All participants **must** enter Malaysia with Visa with Reference (VWR). Participants for the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from **SEARCCT**, **Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Malaysia**. Participant are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission. Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving to Malaysia. Participants from countries listed in https://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country/ are required to take a mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

APPLICATION AND ENQUIRIES

Applications should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available through https://mtcp.kln.gov.my. MTCP application forms can also be obtained from the nearest Malaysian Embassy / High Commission in MTCP recipient countries. Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the following documents:

- Copy of Passport (all coloured pages including blank pages, front & back cover)
- 2 copies Passport sized photo (3.5cm x 5cm) (White background)
- 6 months passport validity
- Medical Report (with clinics' official seal)

All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission of Malaysia.

Successful candidates will be duly notified by SEARCCT, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Malaysia, one (1) month before the commencement of the course.

Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.
