 - Copy of Passport (all colored pages including blank pages, front & back cover)
 - 2 copies Passport sized photo (3.5cm x 5cm) (White background)
 - 6 months passport validity
- Medical Report (with clinics' official seal)
- All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/High Commission of Malaysia.
- Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.
- Successful candidates will be notified with Official Invitation two (2) week from the course date by the Institute via email.
- All applications will be subjected to a strict selection process by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Malaysia under the purview of the International Cooperation and Development Division.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All participants must arrive in Malaysia no later than the date of commencement of the course, unless given permission by the Institute.

- Absence from any of the scheduled sessions during the course, including study visits for any reason is strictly prohibited without prior permission from the Institute.
- All participants are expected to maintain a high level of participation during the lectures, and conduct themselves in an agreeable manner amongst their peers. Any show of poor conduct will be treated seriously and immediate notification will be sent to the participants' mission in Malaysia and to their respective Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- All participants must observe punctuality at all times. Those who are late or miss the IDFR transport must find their own way to the Institute to attend the session, or otherwise will be considered absent.
- Participants are required to dress in formal or office attire throughout the class sessions as well as during official visits to Government Ministries/Agencies.
- After the course, all participants must return to their home country and the Ministry and the Institute will not entertain any requests to travel to neighbouring countries.

COURSE FEES, ACCOMODATION AND MEALS

- All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia
- Accommodation and meals will be provided throughout the duration of the course. Participants are not allowed to bring any family members during the course and change any arrangements done by the Institute.
- All participants will be provided with a daily allowance based on the MTCP regulations which is appropriate for the course duration and subjected to current changes.

AIRFARES

 A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants.

VISA AND VACCINATION

- All participants must enter Malaysia with Visa With Reference (VWR). Participants for the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from the Institute. Participant are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/High Commission. Expenditures on all visa-related fees, airport tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc. are borne by the participants.
- Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving in Malaysia. Participants from countries listed in <u>https://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-</u> <u>requirement-by-country/</u> are required to take mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccination certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

MEDICAL

 Participants should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this programme. In the case of emergencies and need of medical treatment, medical expenses at a government hospital will be borne by the Government of Malaysia. However, medical expenses at private clinics shall be borne by the participants.

ABOUT MALAYSIA

Malaysia is a Southeast Asian country occupying the Malaysian Peninsula and part of the island of Borneo. It is known for its beaches, rainforests, and mix of Malay, Chinese, Indian, and European influences. The sprawling capital, Kuala Lumpur, is home to colonial buildings, modern skyscrapers, lively shopping districts, and dotted with green spaces.

Nestled in between Thailand to the north and Singapore to the south, Malaysia is a federation that consists of 13 states (11 in West Malaysia, and two in East Malaysia) and three federal territories. As a federation, the governance of the country is divided between the federal and the state governments. Malaysia is a parliamentary democracy with a federal constitutional monarch, in which the DYMM Yang di-Pertuan Agong is the head of state and the Prime Minister of Malaysia is the head of government.

Since the early 1980s, Malaysia has steadily diversified its economy. Major changes include a departure from a reliance on the cultivation and export of raw materials, in particular natural rubber, to a focus on services, construction, manufacturing, and tourism. Tourism, in particular, has had a significant impact and, as a generator of foreign exchange.

Malaysia is also a tropical holiday destination, where temperatures fluctuate between 25 and 35 degree Celsius throughout the year. Nice breezes can be enjoyed on the many islands surrounding Malaysia, while the highlands offer cooler temperatures that do not exceed 25 degree Celsius.

ABOUT MTCP

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South–South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasises the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. As of 31st December 2023, 37,815 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.
